SERVICE OF HOLY COMMUNION

ORDER OF SERVICE

At the entry the people stand, prayers are offered and a hymn is announced.

Opening Hymn: To God be the glory, great things he hath done

- 1 To God be the glory, great things He hath done,
So loved He the world that He gave us His Son,
Who yielded His life our redemption to sin,
And opened the life-gate that all may go in.

**Praise the Lord, praise the Lord,
Let the earth hear His voice;
Praise the Lord, praise the Lord,
Let the people rejoice;
Oh, come to the Father, through Jesus the Son,
And give Him the glory; great things He hath done.**

- 2 Oh, perfect redemption, the purchase of blood,
To every believer the promise of God;
The vilest offender who truly believes,
That moment from Jesus a pardon receives.
- 3 Great things He hath taught us, great things He hath done,
And great our rejoicing through Jesus the Son;
But purer, and higher, and greater will be
Our wonder, our transport when Jesus we see.

At the altar the minister reads these scripture sentences.

You shall have a song as in the night when a holy feast is kept; and gladness of heart, as when one sets out to the sound of the pipe to go to the mountain of the Lord, to the Rock of Israel. (*Isaiah 30:29*)

THE COMMANDMENTS

People remain kneeling. Then follows the reading of the Ten Commandments:

Minister Hear the commandments of God and take them to heart. I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods but me.

The Old Testament

Deuteronomy 30:9-14

Reader The portion of scripture read in place of the Old Testament is taken from the Deuteronomy chapter 30 beginning to read at verse 9

Moses said to the people of Israel, "The LORD your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. For the LORD will again take delight in prospering you, just as he delighted in prospering your ancestors, when you obey the LORD your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law, because you turn to the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

"Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe."

The Epistle Testament Reading

Colossians 1:1-14

Reader The Epistle Testament reading is taken from Colossians chapter 1
beginning to read at verse 1

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,
To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae:
Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for
all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of
this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as
it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit
among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of
God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a
faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your
love in the Spirit.

For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

The Gospel

Luke 10:25-37

All stand for the reading, which is introduced with these or appropriate words:

Minister We stand to hear the good news of our salvation, as it is written in the
 Gospel according to Saint Luke chapter 10 beginning to read at verse
 25

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

The Sermon

THE NICENE CREED, introduced by the words:

Minister We stand together with Christians throughout the centuries, and
 throughout the world today, to affirm our faith in the words of the
 Nicene Creed.

ALL We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation. He came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit. He became incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father, He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy, catholic, and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

The people remain kneeling

Minister Hear the words of challenge and comfort our Saviour Christ says to all who follow him. If anyone would come after me, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake will save it. (**Luke 9:23-24**)

Come to me all of you who are tired of carrying your heavy loads, and I will give you rest. (**Matthew 11:18**)

So, all of you who repent of your sins, who love your neighbours and intend to lead a new life, following the way of Jesus, come with faith and take this holy sacrament to strengthen you.

So let us reverently confess our sins to Almighty God.

All Almighty God, Creator of all, you marvellously made us in your image; but we have corrupted ourselves and damaged your likeness by rejecting your love and hurting our neighbours. The Holy Table is prepared for communion. A hymn is sung, during which the offering is collected. The presiding minister and assistants may wash hands. If there is no offering the minister moves directly to the Eucharistic Prayer. When there is an offering, the minister and people may respond in the following or other appropriate manner.

THE BREAKING OF BREAD

The presiding minister performs the traditional actions of taking the bread and the cup. The people remain standing.

Minister Almighty God, Owner of all things, we thank you for giving up your only Son to die on the cross for us who owe you everything. Pour your refreshing Spirit on us as we remember him in the way He commanded, through these gifts of your creation. On the same night that he was betrayed, he took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me'.

People **Amen. His body was broken for us.**

Minister In the same way, after supper He took the cup and gave you thanks; He gave it to them, saying, Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

People **Christ has died,
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.**

Minister We are brothers and sisters through His blood.

People **We have died together
We will rise together
We will live together**

Minister Therefore, heavenly Father, hear us as we celebrate this covenant with joy, and await the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. He died in our place, making a full atonement for the sins of the whole world, the perfect sacrifice, once and for all. You accepted his offering by raising him from death, and granting him great honour at your right hand on high.

The celebrant and assistants receive the bread and wine. The congregation is led by the choir in a musical recitation of the AGNUS DEI

Minister The body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was broken for you, keep
your body and soul in eternal life. Take and eat this, in remembrance
that Christ died for you, and feed on him in you hearts, by faith with
thanksgiving.

Assistant The blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was shed for you, keep
your body and soul in eternal life. Drink this, in remembrance that
Christ's blood was shed for you and be thankful.

As the bread and wine are distributed, the minister or his assistant may say to each communicant:

Minister The body of Christ keep you in eternal life.

Assistant The blood of Christ keep you in eternal life

AFTER COMMUNION

The congregation may observe a brief moment of silence. The people then stand, and the following prayer is said:

ALL God Most High, we thank you for welcoming us, teaching us and feeding us. We deserve nothing from you but in your great mercy, you have given us everything in your Son Jesus Christ. We love you and give ourselves to you to be sent out for your work; Grant us your blessing, now and for ever. Amen.

Thanksgiving Prayer for Receiving Spiritual Communion for those online

In union, O Christ, with those whose have received the Body and Blood of Christ, we offer you our praise and thanksgiving. We present to you our souls and bodies with the desire always to be united to you. And since we cannot now receive you sacramentally, we thank you that you have spiritually into our hearts. We unite ourselves with you and embrace you with all the love of our souls. Let nothing ever separate you from us. May we live in you, and may you live in us, both in this life and in the life to come. Amen

People accompany their first three responses with a sweep of the arm towards the Cross behind the Holy Table, and their final response with a sweeping motion towards heaven

 I will ever give to Thee

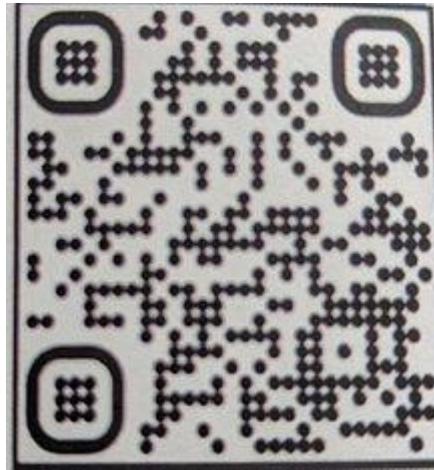
