

Prelude

A bit about Trinity Sunday


Today is Trinity Sunday, the Feast Day for us and for all church communities named for The Holy Trinity. Many churches are named for saints or events in the life of Jesus. On their "patronal feasts," members of those congregations honor the life of particular saints or remember and explore what the Bible tells us of their namesake-event in the life of Jesus. Some of those events are also doctrines of the Church—Incarnation, Transfiguration, Resurrection. We in St. Charles bear the name of a Doctrine of the Church a doctrine that is NOT an event, but a relationship.

My friend and retired Rector of Grace Church in Jefferson City, The Rev. Harv Sanders, used to say that it was "impossible to preach on the Trinity for more than three minutes without becoming heretical." I've always thought that was hilarious, but, on some level, it's true. The doctrine itself simply cannot encompass the mystery of the Holy Trinity—if it could, God would not be God and the dynamic relationship of One God in Three Persons would be a static image. The Creeds we use in worship—the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed—are the Church's shorthand expression of the basic doctrine of the Trinity, the essence of what we believe about the Being of God. We struggle with the Creeds; we struggle with the words and their meaning—and yet, saying those words, even as we struggle and doubt and wonder, gives us a connection back through time and forward into eternity with who God is and who we are as God's people living in God's Creation. (On pp. 864-865 of the Book of Common Prayer in our pew racks, you will find a the Creed of St. Athanasius. It provides an even more concerted effort to explain the Trinity. It will be used at the 12:30 service today, and is traditionally said today in England and in many places throughout the Anglican Communion.)

God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit; Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier; Father, Brother, Mother—all of these terms and many more have been used over time to describe the relationship among, within, between, the God< I AM with God's own self and the human experience of God's Being in our lives and the lives of those who have gone before us. Let us join in singing the great Trinitarian Hymn of the Church, St. Patrick's Breastplate.


