Veterans' Day is Monday, Nov 11. There will be ceremonies around the county, state, and country held in honor of veterans. On Sunday, Nov 10, we honor veterans at Trinity Church. We will ask them to come forward, tell their branch of service, rank, and years in the military, and give thanks for their willingness to serve and sacrifice for our country.
