Dear Friends:

I am so very glad to be with you! Some of you know that I was at Trinity 20 years ago as a newly ordained priest. Trinity has always held a special place in my heart, and it is a blessing to serve you once more.

Times of transition can be anxiety producing. The way things are done changes. The face at the altar and pulpit are different. Things look and feel unfamiliar. That is the nature of transition. An interim period is what is known as a "liminal" time-a time that is in-between one thing and another. It is a time of uncertainty and feeling off-kilter.

If truth be told, all our life is a liminal time, a transitional time. From the time we come from God when we are born to the time we return to God when we die, the space bridging those two events (literally our life span) is transition. Every day is a bridge between yesterday and tomorrow.

During transitional times it is helpful to remember that our God is not a transitional God. God is in time and through time. God walks with us no matter the uncertainty and anxiety, the hardships and challenges. God is our beginning and ending and God is everything inbetween.

In our time together there will be noticeable changes as well as changes that are less so. I do not change things unilaterally, but collaboratively whenever possible. Some changes you may agree with and some you may not, but I am always willing to speak with you about your concerns. We are in this time together and together we will move forward rejoicing in the power of the Spirit!

REMINDER from THE PRAYER MINISTRY



In the Reading from the Book of Galations read in Church this past Sunday, it says, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ" and in Hymn 441, vs 2, it says, "When the woes of life o'er take me, hopes deceive, and fears annoy, never shall the cross forsake me, lo, it glows with peace and joy."

The above verses tell us that when we are overwhelmed with the woes of life, never shall the Cross forsake us because as The Body of Christ our Community is here to bear one another's burdens and build each other up. You may do either of the following:

Someone from our Prayer Ministry will be available after each Service, sitting in the front pew, to pray with you.

A Prayer Box is on the Table in the entrance of the Church for you to write your prayer requests (pen and paper are in the Box) and leave it in the Box. Someone from the Prayer Team will check the Box every week and pray for you or a friend.

We offer Healing Prayers on the Second Sunday every month during the Service, and you are invited forward to be anointed and receive a short prayer.


