Trinity Tidings

Dear Friends.

Summer draws to a close and the program year of the Church begins, still in the long, green Season after Pentecost, also known as Ordinary Time. The term, Ordinary Time, in the sense of regular and consistent, is assigned to the green seasons of the church--the Season after the Epiphany and the weeks of summer and fall that begin after the Day of Pentecost and end on the Last Sunday after Pentecost: The Feast of Christ the King, the Sunday before the Season of Advent begins the New Year of the Church.

In The Season after the Epiphany, the word about The Word spreads. Jesus calls his disciples and begins teaching and healing. More and more people begin to notice and respond to him.

In the Season after Pentecost, the second half of the Church Year, we study the teachings of Jesus and watch the disciples grow in their understanding of who he is and how he points to God and the Reign of God. We begin our "program year" in September, right in the middle of the Season of after Pentecost, right in the middle of the Ordinary Time.

We begin with excitement--our Sunday Forum returns!! On Sep 8, the day we return to two services, we also begin the Forum, returning after some fits and starts in 2023 and mostly non -existent in 2024. Our first Sunday starts with Be Smart, a presentation on gun safety in our homes and with our families. The next two Sundays, we will host Br. Sam Kincade. He will introduce us to the diocesan Rule of Life, explaining what it is and inviting us to begin a spiritual practice that can guide us, personally and collectively, for years to come. On Sep 28, as Saturday, we will participate a Prayer Vigil. On Sunday, Sep 29, we will enjoy a video presentation with action and discussion, featuring our retiring Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, "How to Be a Crazy Christian."

As we conclude the summer, we say goodbye to two long-time parishioners, Bill Cramer, whose memorial service is Aug 30 in Wentzville, and Mary Gibbs, whose service will be held Sep 21 in Salem, MO. We continue to feel their loss, and the loss of all those who have gone before us into the larger life in God. . This fall also involves more focus on the transitions we all face as I approach retirement and as Trinity Church moves into its new future. We will participate in a diocesan program called "Requiem or Renaissance," which begins with a retreat in October. You will hear more and more as time goes on.

Blessings to all as we begin the second half of the long green season of the Church Year together! --TEW


