


Again this year, Lori Cooper is providing us with a "Lenten Wilderness" at the foot of the altar.



We will pray with you, God Bless.


WHAT'S HAPPENING AT TRINITY

"My drawing represents the land that binds us and unites us. Humans are woven together. If someone gives up, others fall. We are all connected to our planet and to each other, but unfortunately we are little aware of it. We are woven together. Other people weave alongside me my own story; and I weave theirs," said the young designer.

In an act of civil disobedience, a group of women and their supporters organize their ordination to become Episcopal priests in 1974. The women are harassed, threatened, and banned from stepping on church property.

In this feature-length documentary film, we meet the women who succeed in building a movement that transforms an age-old institution, and challenges the very essence of patriarchy within Christendom.

We've rented the Hi-Pointe Theatre in St. Louis to show the movie on Saturday, April 13, 2024, at 2 p.m. Doors will open at 1:30 p.m.

Tickets are \$5 per person and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. (The theatre holds 414 people.) The movie will also be open to the general public.


